<u>Sumdog</u>



Your child will bring home weekly spellings to practice. These help prepare your child for their Y6 SATs spelling test, so please encourage your child to practice at home. They should be practicing every night and a spelling test will be every Thursday.

Reading

Reading is a key part of the Year 5 homework. Please encourage your child to keep reading for enjoyment and we suggest at least 10 minutes reading every day. Your child has a Reading Record which we would like signing by a responsible adult who hears your child read. We will be monitoring the reading records so please make sure their book and Reading Record is sent in to school every day!

Year 5 Autumn Curriculum

Our topic for Autumn term is Significant Turning Points in British History.

We are looking at the different conflicts that have impacted and shaped the progress of British history and how these have influenced our British values. Children will using their critical evaluation skills to assess how Britain has changed over the last millenium, politically, religiously and culturally. Linking to our theme, in Art, we are using digital media to express the impact of conflicts and the feelings that may be evoked.

English

In English we will be writing a character description, using their previous knowledge of nouns, pronouns and expanded noun phrases. We will be linking our learning to our new class story, The Lion above the Door by our autumn author, Onjali Q Rauf.

Maths

In Maths this half term we are focusing on children's understanding of number and place value. It is important that in Year 5 they are able to recognise and manipulate numbers up to 1 million. We will also be studying addition and subtraction with increasingly large numbers, using our reasoning and problem-solving skills to solve multi-step problems which involve addition and subtraction.

Science

Our Science topic in Autumn 1 is 'Living things and their Habitats'. Children will be studying the difference in life-cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds, as well as the life cycles of plants. We will also be researching important naturalists and animal behaviourists.

In Year 5 we are trying to develop our independence as learners. We need to remember to be ready for learning for every lesson and remember our own reading books and homework.

Can we please remind parents to ensure names are placed in all item of clothing, including ties.
