








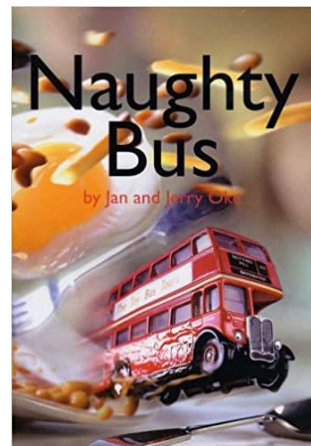


Key Vocabulary

<p>Naughty</p> 	<p>Behaving in a bad way.</p>
<p>Good</p> 	<p>Someone who is behaving well or doing something to high standard</p>
<p>Driver</p> 	<p>Someone who can drive a vehicle</p>
<p>Bus</p> 	<p>A large motor vehicle carrying passengers by road</p>
<p>Vehicles</p>  <p><i>There Are Many Types of Vehicles</i></p>	<p>Carrying or transporting something such as planes, trains, and other vehicles</p>
<p>Traffic</p> 	<p>Vehicles moving slowly on a public highway.</p>
<p>Passengers</p> 	<p>A person who is traveling from one place to another in a car or on a bus, train, ship, airplane, etc. They are not driving or working on it</p>

Key Facts:

- A bus is a type of vehicle which can transport lots of people
- People who travel on buses are called passengers
- A bus with an upstairs is called a double decker
- People wait to catch a bus at a bus stop
- A building where people wait for a bus is called a bus station
- Buses travel on roads, people walk on pavements/ footpaths
