Key Vocabulary

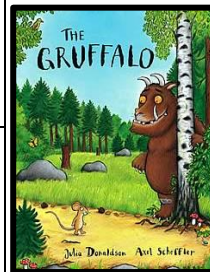
Seasons 	A season is a part of the year.
Winter 	The season between autumn and spring
Leaves 	Leaves are the green part of the plant
Branch 	A part of the tree which grows out from the trunk
Bark 	The protective outer covering of the trunk, branches, and roots of trees and other woody plants
Berries 	Berries are small round fruit that grow on a bush or a tree
Poisonous 	If eaten, can cause sickness or death.

Woods and their trees provide shelter, food and safe places for animals and insects to hide.
