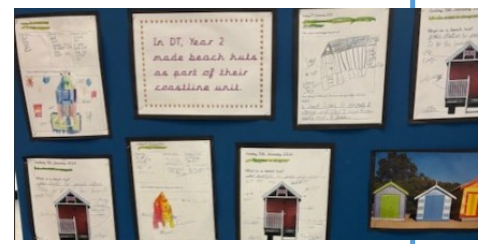
Year 4 Making Papyrus
