Your Child's School Attendance: What You Need to Know

Why Attendance Matters

- It's the Law: You must make sure your child goes to school regularly.
- **Learning & Progress**: Being in school helps your child learn, do well in lessons, and build important skills.
- **Friendships & Routine**: School helps children make friends, learn routines, and grow in confidence.

Your Role as a Parent/Carer

- **Daily Attendance**: Make sure your child goes to school every day unless they're too ill or have permission.
- **Be on Time**: Children should arrive by **8:40 AM** for morning registration.
- Tell Us About Absences:
 - Call or message the school on the first day your child is off.
 - Let us know by phone, email, note, or letter.
 - If there's a bigger issue, speak to our Attendance or Family Support team.

If Your Child Is Absent

- We'll Call You: If we haven't heard from you, we'll call to check everything's okay.
- **Home Visit**: If we can't reach you, we may visit your home.
- **Unexplained Absences**: We'll follow up to make sure your child is safe and record the
- 5 Days Off Without Contact: We must report this to the Children Missing in Education (CME) team.

Authorised vs Unauthorised Absences

Authorised (Allowed by the Headteacher):

- Illness: If your child is genuinely unwell. For sickness/diarrhoea, keep them home for 48 hours.
- **Medical Appointments**: Only for the time needed try to book outside school hours.
- **Proof Needed**: We may ask for an appointment letter or prescription.
- **Special Circumstances**: Things like a close family bereavement or armed forces leave. Apply at least **2 weeks in advance**.

Unauthorised (Not Allowed):

- No valid reason or not approved by school.
- Examples: shopping, holidays, bad weather, sleeping in, sibling is ill.
- Late Arrivals: If your child arrives more than 30 minutes late, it counts as an unauthorised absence.

Being Late

- Arrive by 8:50 AM but aim to be 10 minutes early (gates open from 8.30-8.50am)
- **Late but before register closes** = marked as late.
- Late after register closes (9.30am) = marked as absent.
- Being late often means missed learning and can affect confidence.
- If your child is late **7+ times**, we'll send a letter and may arrange a meeting.

Holidays During Term Time

- **Not Allowed**: Term-time holidays are not approved because they affect learning.
- Only in Rare Cases: You must apply 2 weeks ahead and give full travel details.
- **Legal Action**: Unauthorised holidays may lead to fines.

If Attendance Becomes a Concern

10 – 18 days absent (Frequent Absence):

- We'll contact you and offer support.
- If things don't improve, we'll arrange a meeting and may start an Early Help Assessment (EHA).

19 or more days absent (Persistent Absence):

- This is serious. We'll follow Birmingham's **Support First** process.
- You'll be invited to a **Formal Attendance Meeting** and asked to sign an Attendance Plan.
- We may involve health or support services.

Legal Consequences

- Not sending your child to school regularly is a **criminal offence**.
- **Penalty Notices:**
 - First time: £80 per parent (rises to £160 if unpaid).
 - Second time: £160 per parent.
 - Third time: May go straight to Magistrates' Court.
- Court Fines: Up to £2,500 per parent, plus costs or even prison (up to 3 months).
- **Criminal Record**: This could affect your future.
