At Greet we develop children's positive learning behaviours through the 'Greet Drum Beat' behaviour curriculum. This curriculum defines 'the way we do things' at our school.

We define clearly the behaviours and habits that we expect students to demonstrate. We want to support our pupils to grow into adults who are polite, respectful, empathetic and appreciative and who can put others before themselves when necessary. We believe that as pupils practise these behaviours, over time they become habits that positively shape how they feel about themselves and how other people perceive them.



Greet Walking

We know that we walk around school using Greet Walking. Greet Walking means

- facing forwards
- walking at a steady pace,
- o in a straight line
- with hands by ourselves
- without talking.

We do this to keep everyone safe in school and to make sure we do not disrupt other children's learning.



Greet Stop Signal

We know that we use the Greet Stop Signal in class or around school to indicate that we need to listen to an adult.

The Greet Stop Signal is:

- \circ '3 2 1, show me Greet Listening'.
- o put all equipment down
- show Greet Listening.



Greet Listening

We know that we use Greet Listening in class. This means that we:

- face forwards
- keep our hands together
- sit up straight
- never interrupt
- pay attention to the speaker.

We all do Greet Listening to ensure everybody is able to learn without distractions.

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Curriculum - whole school unit


The whole school started the year with the same unit of work; 'Here We Are'.

Maths Curriculum

This half term, we will be focussing on 'Place value and number'.

We will move on to using all four operations later in the term and next term.

Your child will have an opportunity to learn about shape, measure and statistics.

Maths homework for KS2 will be set on Maths Flex, School Jam activities will be assigned for KS1. Logins will be the same for the children as their Bug Club logins.



PE

Our PE day is **Tuesdays.**

PE kit:

- White polo shirt or white t-shirt
- Navy blue, royal blue or black shorts / joggers / leggings
- Navy blue, royal blue or black sweatshirts (either hoodies, sweatshirts or sweat-cardigans)
- Black plimsolls or trainers (any colour)

Children can wear their PE kit to school on PE days.

Uniform

- Jumpers and cardigans are royal blue. These can either be plain or with the Greet logo.
- Trousers, skirts, dresses, leggings and shorts should be grey only (children can wear blue gingham dresses in the summer term).
- Socks should be either white, black or grey. Tights should be either black or grey.
- White polo-neck shirt or a white collared shirt.
- Footwear should only be black school shoes or plain black trainers. No boots. (In winter, children can wear boots for the journey, but must change into school footwear)



Uniform

- All religious headwear should be royal blue or white.
 Headscarves must be fitted for health and safety reasons.
- Jewellery is limited to studs only for health and safety reasons and a simple wristwatch (no smart watches). Items of religious jewellery may be worn.



Reading and Homework

- Reading: Children will be allowed to choose 1 book every week from the school library. This book must be returned back to school. If children lose/damage this book it will have to be replaced and paid for.
- Maths: Homework will be carefully selected based on topics taught in class on Maths Flex (demonstrate how to access).
- Spelling: Children will have weekly spellings that they will be tested on the following week.
- Additional homework: Children may receive grammar work to support taught grammar sessions in class.



50 Books reading challenge

We have identified 50 books from years 1 to 6 for children to challenge themselves to read across the academic year.

Children will get rewards when they have read a specified number.

We have copies of the books in school but you can also get copies out of the local library to support them in achieving the challenge.



Importance of attendance

Research conducted by the Department of Education found; "That missing school for even a day can mean a child is less likely to achieve good grades, which can have a damaging effect on their life chances."

Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)

- Key Stage 2 assessment to be taken by pupils at the end of Year
 4.
- Two-week window assessment period in June.
- The purpose is to ensure the times tables knowledge is at the expected level (12x12).
- 25 questions, 6 seconds to answer each question.
- No pass mark.
- Daily practise on TT Rockstars to improve speed and accuracy.
