At Greet we develop children's positive learning behaviours through the 'Greet Drum Beat' behaviour curriculum. This curriculum defines 'the way we do things' at our school.

We define clearly the behaviours and habits that we expect students to demonstrate. We want to support our pupils to grow into adults who are



polite, respectful, empathetic and appreciative and who can put others before themselves when necessary. We believe that as pupils practise these behaviours, over time they become habits that positively shape how they feel about themselves and how other people perceive them.

Greet Walking

We know that we *walk* around school using Greet Walking. Greet Walking means \circ facing forwards \circ walking at a steady pace, \circ in a straight line \circ with hands by ourselves \circ without talking.



We do this to keep everyone safe in school and to make sure we do not disrupt other children's learning.

This unit celebrates every child as an individual whilst allowing them to explore and recognise their place within the communities to which they belong.




This unit has been designed to cover aspects of geography and writing in equal parts.

Maths Curriculum

Uniform

- Jumpers and cardigans are royal blue. These can either be plain or with the Greet logo.
- Trousers, skirts, dresses, leggings and shorts should be grey only (children can wear blue gingham dresses in the summer term).
- Socks should be either white, black or grey. Tights should be either black or grey.
- White polo-neck shirt or a white collared shirt.
- Footwear should only be black school shoes or plain black trainers. No boots. (In winter, children can wear boots for the journey, but must change into school footwear)



Uniform

- All religious headwear should be royal blue or white. Headscarves must be fitted for health and safety reasons.
- Jewellery is limited to studs only for health and safety reasons and a simple wristwatch (no smart watches). Items of religious jewellery may be worn.
