Pyramids - ancient masonry structures located in Egypt

Pharaohs – A king or queen (ruler) in Ancient Egypt

Burial – a ceremony at which someone's body is buried

Tombs - a place in which kings were buried when they died

Sarcophagus - is a stone coffin or a container to hold a coffin

Mummy/ Mummification the dead body of a human being or animal preserved by the ancient Egyptian process

Canopic jars - during the mummification process to store and preserve the viscera of their owner for the afterlife.

Scribe - people in ancient Egypt (usually men) who learned to read and write

Hieroglyphs – the formal writing system used in Ancient Egypt

Papyrus - a material on which to write, prepared from thin strips of the pith of this plant laid together, soaked, pressed, and dried

Carab - a symbol of renewal and rebirth.

Tutankhamen - was an ancient Egyptian pharaoh who was the last of his royal family

Sphinx - a creature with the body of a lion and the head of a human
