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Grove Academy SAFE PARKING

Dear Parents/carers

We strive to make the routes to and from our academy as safe as possible for all road users and pedestrians. Unfortunately this still remains a real issue due to a minority who simply disregard simple road safety rules, so here is a reminder for us all

LETS PROTECT CHILDREN'S SAFETY GETTING TO AND FROM SCHOOL EACH AND EVERY DAY

You MUST NOT wait or park, or stop to set down and pick up passengers ,on school entrance markings. The yellow zig zags are there to provide an unrestricted view for approaching drivers and children and wait to cross.

REMEMBER! to slow down past our academy at all times of the day, weekends and school holidays

Please do not obstruct the pavement outside of school. Keep the path safe so that children DO NOT have to walk on the road

•Do not run across busy roads with your children – use the crossings



EXIT AND ENTER children om the kerb side of the vehicle where possible

What are we doing about this?

- We have already secured a small staff car park, which takes 13 cars off the surrounding roads, easing congestion.
- We continue to report every incident to the local council
- We regularly request the CCTV car to patrol at busy times
- Most importantly, we are working with the local council to implement some measures, particularly on Turner street, to make our environment safer. Unfortunately these measures are making very slow progress as they will impact on the local community. we have been discussing these measures since September 2021 and they still have not been approved. Again, I reassure you that we report every incident / near miss into the team dealing with project, and request regular updates on the work.
- We are working with the council to secure Park and Stride permits for parents to park at Forrest Park and walk to Grove (a very short walk – good for everyone's step count!). Due to us changing the time of our school day recently, the permits offered to us at the moment do not cover the times we need but we are confident of reaching a solution so watch this space!

THANKS TO EVERYONE WHO DOES PARK AND DRIVE RESPONSIBLY AND HELPS US ALL TO STAY SAFE

•Teach your child about road safety if they are walking to school on their own

Please DO NOT PARK PARTLY OR WHOLLY ON THE PAVEMENT. This can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians as well as wheelchairs, pushchairs, young cyclists and prevent children being seen when crossing

NO STOPPING , NO EXCUSES. IGNORANCE OF ROAD SAFETY IS SELFISH AND DANGEROUS

From 14th-18th March, we celebrated British Science Week! This year's theme was 'Growth'. We decided that we would explore the growth of cities; we investigated how cities must grow with the help of STEM developments to be able to cater for an increasing population. In Year 3 and 4, we looked at how companies have developed strategies for clearing oil spills when they occur in the oceans. We made a practical representation to show this and worked to clear up our 'spill' using a variety of methods. In Year 5 and 6, we explored the need for renewable energy sources; we discussed the advantages and disadvantages of energy sources used regularly in Britain today, and the challenges these could cause for us in the future. We created our own wind turbine to generate wind energy, following a design brief and trialling our ideas. We also had some fantastic entries for the BSW Poster competition which have been entered into a national draw. Keep your fingers crossed for a Grove winner!

We have decided to enter a cross-country competition for the first ever time at Grove! So we have started some trials to pick our teams.
