Curriculum Coverage

The children will be studying the following topics over the next term:

English: The Indian in the cupboard is our reading book for this term. We are extremely excited to share this book with you and use it to support our learning of: organising writing into paragraphs, punctuating direct speech and editing and improving our work.

Maths: We will be learning to multiply using the formal written method, using place value to multiply and divide mentally and to multiply and divide three numbers. In order to support our understanding of multiplication and the inverse we will look at how to use factor pairs in our mental calculations.

<u>Science:</u> This term we will be looking into Electricity, circuits and changing states of matter. We will investigate how the Romans collected energy and other resources.

Through our cross-curricular links, we will be learning all about the Romans, including:

<u>History:</u> The Growth of the Roman Empire and its impact on countries in and around Europe.

<u>Geography:</u> Mapping the route of the Roman Empire, identifying Hadrian's wall.

Art: studying and recreating Roman mosaics

<u>D&T</u>: creating Roman shields and Roman roads.

PSHE: Me and others, tolerance and respect

RE: Why Jesus is inspirational to Christians.

<u>Music:</u> to listen to, appreciate music linked to Empires—Darth Vader's Imperial March

PE: Dodge-ball and Bench-ball.
