In order to ensure that learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation, Grove Road CP School has developed the following plan. This plan offers remote learning opportunities whilst also acknowledging that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard-copies of work and resources.

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

1. An individual is self-isolating because of a positive test within the household;
2. A group of children are self-isolating because of a case of coronavirus in the bubble;
3. A teacher is self-isolating pending a positive test result;
4. A teacher is self-isolating following a positive test result;
5. A whole bubble or cohort is self-isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus

The plan complies with the expectations and principles outlined in the DFE document [Guidance for Full Opening of Schools](#).

Software and online platforms

Within all plans, teachers will set appropriate work in-line with our current curriculum, primarily supplemented by a range of resources provided by: White Rose Maths, in-school planning / resourcing systems and tasks available via the digital systems in place in school. Grove Road CP School will be using systems already in place during 'normal' teaching time to reduce transition issues for staff and children in the event that change is required

Children will remain in contact with their Class teacher through Seesaw

In the event of any form of isolation and loss of learning caused by Coronavirus (COVID-19), parents must understand that engagement in home learning is compulsory, as is the expectation that Grove Road CP School makes that provision available and accessible to all. However, if children themselves are too ill to attend then they should not be expected to engage in home learning.

In preparation for home-learning, parents and children need to receive logins and passwords for the following platforms (likewise teaching staff need to be familiar with them):

- Seesaw
- IXL (upper KS2 only)
- Sumdog
- TTR
- Bug Club (EYFS / KS1 only)
- Accelerated Reader (Years 2-6 only)
- Charanga
- Pobble

Worksheets and Practical Resources

If a child is isolated from school i.e. the child is sent home from school to either receive a test or self-isolate as someone in the household is being tested, they will leave school with a pack of work and their own stationery pack. Children will have immediate opportunity to continue their learning.

The work packs should be basic skills work that would be relevant at any stage of the year i.e. arithmetic, spelling, reading, writing (with a visual prompt) and handwriting.

Two week practical packs:

If a child is isolated from school i.e. the child is sent home from school to either receive a test or self-isolate as someone in the household is being tested, they will be given a 2 week 'practical pack':

- All phases have 2 week isolation packs in place, as constructed by class teachers and quality assured by phase leaders. These are stored on staff shared (the school's server) and master copies are in the school office, ready to be copied and deployed as required within 24 hours of absence notification. Isolation packs include topic webs, learning schedules, useful websites, Pie Corbett reading / writing packs, logins (if required) and Pobble non-screen time activities alongside other, class-specific tasks and ideas. These will be updated on a half-termly basis.
- Monitoring arrangements: phase leaders will ensure that 2 week packs are updated in the office and on staff shared each half term. These will be submitted to the curriculum lead and phase leaders as they are saved to ensure the curriculum offer is consistent across school.
- Admin staff will ask for hard copy work to be photographed and uploaded to Seesaw or will collect it after 2 weeks

In the event of staff isolation, pending Covid test results for themselves or a family member, they will provide a mixture of live and digital classroom support to ensure that the curriculum expectations are met with minimal disruption to the children. This will include: a daily, live welcome; a daily, live reading session; pre-recorded chapters / sections of class stories on Seesaw and live marking / feedback via Seesaw. The class will be covered accordingly and all planning and resources will be shared at least 24 hours prior to teaching to support with delivering in-class sessions effectively.

- Monitoring arrangements: Seesaw will be monitored by the curriculum lead and phase leaders to ensure engagement remains high within classes with isolated teachers. Emails containing planning and resources will be CC'd to phase leaders and the curriculum lead to ensure they are passed on to relevant supply / cover teachers.

Remote Learning

The initial response to any isolation will be to provide children with home learning materials alongside their class stationery pack (this might need to be delivered). In the case of whole cohort isolation, resources will be uploaded to Seesaw and priority children will have packs delivered where required. This measure will afford teachers a short time to prepare their remote learning resources:

Bubble (or phase / whole school) closure

- In the event of a bubble closing, following a positive Covid test, the class will move onto a digital curriculum. This is detailed on the school home learning web page available on <https://www.groveroad.n-yorks.sch.uk/our-school/home-learning-plan>. Each phase has a schedule with a mix of live, typed and voice note feedback and pre-recorded teaching alongside activities and projects and access to a range of websites / resources. Activities and pre-recorded teaching will take place on Seesaw and live marking will take place via the comments sections on children's work. Seesaw class blogs will be used to share good quality work across classes. If a teacher is sick, then their class will mirror their neighbour class and the phase team (supported by the phase and curriculum leads) will ensure that planning and resourcing are provided in due course. Live teaching cannot take place due to issues with multiple children accessing devices at home and those struggling to access the internet. School will loan ChromeBooks to those families unable to provide digital access. The bubble closure schedules for each phase are detailed below.
- Monitoring and quality assurance: Phase leaders and the curriculum lead will monitor the systems in place using a range of systems already in place. Seesaw updates will be tracked, including daily usage, number of uploads, parent's visits / comments, children's comments across school and within classes. Sumdog, Times Table Rockstars, Accelerated Reader, IXL and all other relevant systems will be monitored by phase leaders and subject leaders (e.g. maths lead to monitor IXL, TTR and Sumdog engagement across school). All tracking will be fed back to the curriculum lead and head teacher on a weekly basis.
