Additional Mobile Data for disadvantaged pupils

The department for Education is piloting a scheme to temporarily increase data allowances for disadvantaged children and young people in years 3 to 11 who are not able to attend school due to national lockdown restrictions. They must meet all 3 of these criteria:

- Do not have fixed internet at home
- Cannot afford additional data for their devices
- Are experiencing disruption to their face-to-face education.

Networks who are part of the trial scheme at present are; Three, Smarty, Virgin Mobile, EE, Tesco mobile, Sky mobile.
