

Return to school

Grove Vale will be welcoming back all children as normal on **Monday <u>8th March</u>** including before and after school club provision and we look forward to the children's return. The government has said that attendance for children will revert to being compulsory as it was before the lockdown.

In order to minimise the contact between year groups, it will be necessary to have staggered drop off and collection times (apart from preschool as times remain the same). There will be a one-way system in operation for entry and exit to the site in the Infant playground that must be observed to protect all concerned.

International Maths Day

On <u>Monday 15th March</u> Grove Vale will be acknowledging International maths day, this day aims to get students excited and enthusiastic about learning Maths.

Purpose of this day:

- Raising the Profile of Maths for Students and Staff

- Devote time to retrieval of maths facts
- Outdoor maths and real life maths
- Look at current maths work around the census
- Opportunities to be creative, ambitious, resilient and curious

World Book Day

All of the pupils in school and working remotely have had a fantastic day celebrating world book day.

Reception pupils have talked about which characters they have come dressed up as and what their favourite books are. They have completed oral book reviews, decorated book marks, made front covers for their favourite books and made their own books.

Year 1 have had a very exciting day, sharing books, writing about their costume and characters and completing story telling yoga!



Year 2 started the day with a Teams meeting where we listened and shared with friends at home what we have dressed as and why we chose this. We have then done a character profile of who we are and a book review of our favourite book that we have bought into school today. This afternoon we are going to go through our "masked reader" quiz, and a words game before doing something creative, making a cat in the hat from a paper plate and then making stick man from a stick

Year 3 had a creative afternoon choosing a character from a book and used a range of materials : paints, oil pastel, gel trio and collage to decorate their character. Children also went on an orienteering book hunt around the play-ground, Wally was a bit hard to find !!!

Year 4 have emerged themselves into world book day both in school and at home. We began with a catwalk and discussion of our outfits and our favourite books to read. The level of effort was outstanding for all children, we were so impressed! We read a fiction and a non fiction text and answered various questions about it. Children also entered a competition to be included in a Grove Vale book.... so exciting. We finished by choosing our favourite books, writing a detailed book review about it and also designed a new front cover based on their favourite part of that text.



Year 5 came dressed as their favourite book characters by their favourite authors! We had a few Harry Potters, George's Marvellous Medicine by Roald Dahl, Hetty Feather by Jacqueline Wilson and Arrietty from The Borrowers. Children brought their favourite book into school. We also wrote a book review about our current class-read that we have using for English and Geography - Journey to the River Sea by Eva Ibbotson.

Year 6 had a lovely day celebrating World Book Day. We started the day with a Teams meeting where children at home and in school were able to take part in a book character quiz as well as enjoying a

giggle guessing the 'Masked Reader'....Sandwell's answer to Boris Johnson even made a guest appearance! Later in the day, the children were able to pick from a selection of activities including creating pop art characters, making book trailers on imovie/ powerpoint and producing our own storyland maps for famous locations eg. Wonderland and Hogwarts.
