Year 5 Trip to the Synagogue

Year 5 visited Singers Hill Synagogue to learn about how people of the Jewish faith practice their religion. At the door, all the boys had to wear a kepal ,which was a small cap to cover the head, as a mark of respect. We found out that practising male Jews always have their head covered. When touring around the synagogue we observed the ornate stained glass windows which depicted Birmingham's history and also key events from the Old testament of the Bible. They looked at some Hebrew writing and by using a clock in the Synagogue we were able to decipher the numbers and noted them down in out draft books. Behind the bimah (altar where the Rabbi conducts his services), we saw several Torahs which were adorned with gold. Finally we took part in a mock wedding ceremony, which we all enjoyed.
