

## **Road Safety Awareness**







On Monday we launched our Pupil Road safety Wardens as part of our road safety awareness day. All week the pupils have been out on duty in the mornings and after school monitoring the parking of parents. You may have noticed that we have had new blue cones to show no parking zones, banners and bollard signs. The new cones and pupil parking wardens have had a positive impact as we have definitely seen a reduction in dangerous parking. However we have seen an increase in parents letting their children out of the car whilst sat in traffic and children running across the road without supervision. We have also noticed an increase in the number of lates; we fully appreciate there is reduced parking close to the school however we would advise parents to leave earlier as they may have to park further away from school and walk the last part of their journey. Thank you to all the parents for your continued support with this cause, we hope that you understand how we are trying to safe guard our children and make sure they are safe coming to school.

On Thursday parents were sent a letter from West Midlands Police after they received a number of complaints from local residents about the parking in and around the School and concerns for the safety of pupils. Residents/Teachers have raised concerns that cars are creating an obstruction by parking dangerously on the bend, over dropped gutters, completing dangerous manoeuvres, stopping on zigzag lines and allowing children to disembark parent's vehicles at great risk to the child. They would like to make all parents aware that PCSO's will be conducting patrols with the intention of recording and photographing evidence. Those caught in contravention of road traffic laws will be issued with £90 fixed penalty notices.

On Friday morning the PCSO's were on patrol and a parent was on-the-spot fined £90 and given 3 points on their license for parking on the pavement. School have been advised that in the future we can take photos of illegal parking and send these to the police for drivers to be punished.

# **Fizz Free February**


