Results Day

Given the current situation it is highly unlikely that we will be able to run our results day in the same format as we have in the past. We will therefore be sending out results via email. These results will be sent to **Name**'s Guiseley School email address. We will also be sending out a hard copy of the results in the post. Name can reset her password using her pin number which is: **PIN**.

After **Name** has received her results we will be using a booking system to allow students, who need support or guidance with their next steps, to arrange a socially distanced face to face meeting with Mrs Button, Mr Gracey or myself. A Level Grades

I have included an info graphic at the end of this email which explains the process that Ofqual have used for generating the A level grades. For those students who are not happy with the grade they have received and who believe they could have done better if they had the opportunity to sit the exam, Ofqual have now confirmed that a full suite of examinations will run in the autumn. It should be noted that with the exception of Art and Design, grades from this autumn series will be based on exam performance alone and will not take into account any non-examined assessment (NEA). The exact timing of these exams is yet to be confirmed but Ofqual are aiming for AS and A levels to be held in October and GCSE's in November.

University Information

If **Name** has applied to university, then the university will contact her via email on results day. In the past students have been made aware of their university place before we are allowed to release the results. For this reason it is vital that the contact details, that **Name** has given to UCAS, are up to date.
