### **Performing Arts Competition**

Do you want to be a politician, newsreader, teacher or even a youtuber?

On Friday 9th February 2024, in the evening we are running a performing arts competition for our children which may help. There are three age groups: Year 2 and under, Year 4 and under and Year 6 and under and there are three categories you can enter in each of the age groups.

1. Recital set piece. Learning the given poem and then reciting it from memory (practise at home/school first).

2. Reading set piece. Reading the narrative text from the book (practise at home/school first).

3. Sight reading. Reading a given piece out loud but only after seeing it for the first time two minutes before the performance.

### **Golden Tickets**

The children are awarded golden tickets for behaviour and effort, and displaying the school values of kindness, honesty, confidence, responsibility and respect. The tickets are put in a hat and names drawn out in Monday's assembly. We will still do this but after talking to our Governors we have decided to make a change. If a child is given a ticket they will still put it in the 'hat' for Monday's assembly but they will also mark it on a tally chart against their name. If over the course of a term they get 20 tickets they can either bank them or exchange the tickets for a 20 ticket prize. If they bank them they can aim for a 50 ticket prize or even a 100 ticket prize. Once the prize has been awarded and at the start of each term we will wipe the tally charts clear and start again.

### **Social Media and Messaging**

In our PSHE lessons, we are doing everything we can to provide the children with information about on-line safety and give them a chance to discuss their use of social media. We are organising additional input from 4YP for upper KS2 children. However, most social media apps (Whatsapp, Instagram, Snapchat) have an age limit of 13 or above. This is not because they are difficult to use but because it is difficult for younger children to deal with the consequences of negative messaging. If a problem does arise, the Police and the Child Exploitation and On-line Centre (CEOPs) say that primary school children should not be using these platforms and state that it is a question of responsibility and parental ultimately safeguarding.

So with this advice in mind, please make sure you know what your child is doing on-line and who they are messaging. Our staff do not have the time or capacity during the school day to investigate on-line incidents. The fall-out is upsetting to your child which then impacts on their ability to focus on their learning in school.
