
Year 3 Trip to the Owl Sanctuary

Social Media and Messaging

In our PSHE, lessons we are doing everything we can to provide the children with information about on-line safety and give them a chance to discuss their use of social media. We are organising additional input from 4YP for our upper KS2 children. However, most social media apps (Whatsapp, Instagram, Snapchat) have an age limit of 13 or above. This is not because they are difficult to use but because it is difficult for younger children to deal with the consequence of negative messaging. If a problem does arise, the Police and the Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre (CEOPs) say that primary school children simply shouldn't be using these platforms and state that it is a question of parental responsibility and ultimately safeguarding.

So with this advice in mind, please make sure you know what your child is doing on-line and who they are messaging. Our staff do not have the time or capacity during the school day to investigate on-line incidents.

You continue to keep pushing and encouraging.


More homework!


