### Dear Parents/Carers

Gusford would like to ask you to encourage your child to have a school meal on Thursday 16th May as it is Census Day. This benefits the school for the whole academic year. We are serving Fish fingers and chips or Jacket Potato with cheese/beans, followed by Vanilla Shortbread or Fresh fruit salad, as well as our ever popular 'ham roll - pick and mix' in order to appeal to as many children as possible.

For every infant child (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) that has a school meal on Thursday 16th May, the school will receive government funding to pay for provision of universal free school meals for infant pupils. Because our funding is based the number of meals taken on census days, if our numbers are low the school will not receive enough funding to match the actual costs of providing meals throughout the year, and this will mean we have to use other school money for this purpose. Please support the school by encouraging your child to have a school meal on this day, even if they don't normally have school meals.

School meals are free for infant pupils so it will cost parents nothing to support the school in this way. Junior meals cost £2.40, unless your child is eligible for free school meals. It will also help our funding if our junior pupils who are eligible for free school meals have a school dinner on census day.

# Music of the Month - April Nina Simone



- Nina Simone was an American singer who became famous in the 1950s.
- She was very musically talented and started to teach herself the piano when she was 3 years old.
- She became famous not only because she was a brilliant pianist but also due to her unique and beautiful voice.
- She became very good at the piano and did a solo performance when she was 11 years old. At the performance, her parents sat at the front to see her play but were moved to the back because they were black. Nina refused to start playing until her parents were moved back to their original seats.

## Gusford Summer 1 Science Heroes

## **Year 1 - Beatrix Potter (1866 - 1943)**



Beatrix Potter was an English writer, illustrator, natural scientist and conservationist. She is very well known for writing The Tale of Peter Rabbit but she was also interested in mycology, the study of fungi.

## Year 2 - Agnes Arber (1879 - 1960)

Agnes Arber was a British botanist and plant morphologist (somebody who studies the physical form of plants).

She introduced the idea of the partial shoot theory in which each part of the plant is either a shoot or a partial shoot.



## Year 3 - Joseph Banks (1743 - 1820)



Joseph Banks was an English botanist who publicly supported scientific exploration and oversaw many voyages. He was the first person to introduce the Western world to acacia, mimosa and eucalyptus.

## Year 4 - Ivan Pavlov (1849 - 1936)

Ivan Pavlov was a Russian neurologist and physiologist. He discovered classical conditioning which is how we develop our emotional responses to people and events.



## Year 5 - David Attenborough (1926)



David Attenborough is a British biologist and natural historian. He is very famous for making documentaries about natural history and has many species named after him.

## Year 6 - Leonardo Da Vinci (1452 - 1519)

Leonardo Da Vinci was an Italian artist, engineer and scientist who made scientific investigations into anatomy, zoology and the science of flight. He created many inventions including a flying machine, a parachute and a revolving bridge.


