If you have any good quality second hand shoes that no longer fit we would really appreciate it if you gave them one last clean, checked you can still see the size and then sent them into school. We will spray them with anti-bacterial spray and then offer them to anyone that might find them useful.



Please note that if your child has more than four days unauthorised absence then both parents will be issued with a £60 fine for each child It may appear a little harsh but our approach has to be clear and unequivocal. Thank you for your support in this matter. From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. This rate is in line with inflation and is the first increase since 2012. In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160. Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered. All fines go directly to Suffolk County Council and not the school.

Everyone is welcome to come and enjoy the day with us even if they aren't going to the circus. If you purchase circus wristbands, these will need to be collected when you enter the site on the day. 
Gusford Summer 2 Science Heroes Year 1 - Holly Green (1979)




Holly Green is an English meteorologist. She is famous for being part of the BBC weather team and regularly presents the weather. Holly has a maths degree and a masters in meteorology.

Year 2 - Isaac Newton (1643 - 1727)

Isaac Newton was an English mathematician, astronomer and physicist. He is famous for his discoveries around gravity and the three laws of motion. He left school at 12 to work on the family farm but missed school so much that he returned!



Year 3 - Henry Ford (1863 - 1947)



Henry Ford was an American engineer and businessman. He is famous for founding the Ford Motor Company and he did this by pioneering the assembly line. Ford produces cars including Ford, Lincoln, Mercury, Volvo, Mazda and Land Rover.

Year 4 - Jacques Cousteau (1910 - 1997)

Jacques Cousteau was a French ocean explorer. He is famous for his extensive undersea investigations and for co-inventing the first fully automatic compressed-air Aqua-Lung (underwater breathing apparatus).



Year 5 - Louis Pasteur (1822 - 1895)



Louis Pasteur was a French microbiologist and chemist. He is famous for developing a way of keeping milk from going sour for longer periods of time. This is called pasteurization.

Year 6 - Percy Shaw (1890 - 1976)

Percy Shaw OBE was an English inventor and businessman. He is famous for inventing the 'Cats' Eye'. This is a special glass and metal bead that is set into the road. When it is dark, the light from car headlights reflects back from the bead lighting up the route.

PLAY TOGETHER

By playing Palworld yourself, you'll have the best chance of catching any content that you don't think is suitable for children, as well as getting an idea of how violence is presented in the game. The conflict is cartoonish in nature – until players and Pals unlock the ability to use guns, at which point it can become more intense. It's likely best for you to give it a look and form uner own encience. and form your own opinion

PLACE BOUNDARIES

Limit options when it comes to online play. For players on PC, they'll still be able to cooperate with friends through the game's multiplayer option, much like Xbox users. Just because they have the option to run a dedicated server that's open to anyone doesn't mean they need to take it. The risks of interacting with strangers can be significantly lowered or even eliminated entirely by playing on servers which are restricted to friends only. can be significantly lowe restricted to friends only.
