School Attendance Fines

Please note that if your child has more than four days unauthorised absence then both parents will be issued with a £60 fine for each child It may appear a little harsh but our approach has to be clear and unequivocal. Thank you for your support in this matter. From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. This rate is in line with inflation and is the first increase since 2012. In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160. Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered. All fines go directly to Suffolk County Council and not the school.

By supporting us today, you will help James' Team buy books to support positive wellbeing for every year 6 child at Gusford Primary School.



Pop Up Circus are bringing their circus tent to set up on the school field and bring fun and laughs to our school community. ON THE DAY

Everyone is welcome to come and enjoy the day with us even if they aren't going to the circus. If you purchase circus wristbands, these will need to be collected when you enter the site on the day. We will have a desk at the gate with a list of names and how many tickets were purchased and you will be given a coloured wristband for your show time, these need to be put on at entry as they are your ticket. We understand some children may not be willing to wear a wristband so if this is the case an adult can wear the child's wristband as well as their own and just enter the circus tent together.

Please note - No pushchairs are allowed in the circus tent due to fire regulations

There is a mixture of seats and mats for watching the show. Adults are encouraged to use the seats and children to sit on the mats, however this is flexible so if you want to sit on the mats with your children or have your children sit on the chairs with you this will be possible, as long as space allows.

10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators D C 0

In school sports, fair play and friendly competition are important for character development. Fair play embodies respect and integrity while good-natured competition balances rivalry with camaraderie. This guide addresses potential challenges — like the pressure to win — and offers practical tips on instilling values of fair play and cultivating a positive sporting environment for young athletes.

ORANGE N LGREEN TEAM

1 LEAD BY EXAMPLE

Parents, carers and teachers should try to exemplify fair play: demonstrating respect for opponents, coaches and officials. Children frequently learn by observing adult behaviour, so displaying a sense of fair play sets a powerful precedent for them to follow in their own actions on and off the field.

2 OUTCOME

Encourage children to focus on giving it their all, rather than basing their entire performance on whether they win or not. This fosters a growth mindset, where the journey and the process of improvement are valued just as much as the end result. It also reduces the pressure to "win at all costs", which can be a harmful outlook in some situations.

SET CLEAR 3 **EXPECTATIONS**

Establish clear guidelines and expectations for behaviour before, during and after sporting events. Ensuring that children understand what is considered acceptable conduct helps preven misunderstandings and promotes a positive, respectful atmos

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HIGHLIGHT 4 COOPERATION

Underline the value of teamwork and cooperation in achieving success. Success isn't just about Individual achievements, but about how well the team communicates, encourages each other and works together towards a common goal. A strong focus on cooperation fosters camaraderie and mutual support ong players.

DISCUSS ACCEPTING 5 DEFEAT

Help children to understand that they can't win every contest – that losing occasionally is a natural part of both sport and life in general. Teaching them to accept deleat gracefully and learn from their mistakes promotes resilience, humility and the ability to bounce back stronger from setbacks. Taking a loss in one's stride is also an admirable trait and can help children and young people garner respect in their future life.

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ENCOURAGE INCLUSIVE

PARTICIPATION

Promote an environment where all children feel weicome and valued, regardless of their skill level. Prioritise the importance of participation and enjoyment over winning, creating a supportive atmosphere where every child can thrive and develop their abilities without unnecessary pressure.

RESOLUTION SKILLS

Teach children how to resolve conflicts peacefully and respectfully, both on and off the field. Providing them with strategies for effective communication and problem-solving helps build stronger relationships and enhances their ability to navigate challenges, which can be a huge boon to them throughout their adult lives.

Emphasise to children the importance of respecting everyons involved in the game, regardless of the outcome. Respect for your teammates, opponents, coaches and officia helps to create a positive, inclusive sports environment where everyone can feel value and appreciated.

GIVE CONSTRUCTIVE

Offer feedback that focuses on areas for Improvement rather than unfiltered criticism. Praise what a child has done well and advise on how to improve, rather than simply pointing out shortcomings. Encouraging a growth mindset and highlighting progress helps children to develop confidence, resilience and a desire to continue striving for excellence.

CELEBRATE GOOD

SPORTSMANSHIP

Try to avoid solely drawing attention to children's physical performance on the field. Recognise and celebrate acts of sportsmanship, fair play and kindness, too. By spotlighting positive behaviour, you reinforce the importance of such conduct and inspire children to practite this in the future, creating a culture of respect and camaraderie within the sports community that does wonders for morele.
