


# Attendance

# PE kit and changing arrangements for next year

We have listened to feedback from parents over the course of the last year and decided to slightly change our PE kit for the juniors (Years 3,4,5 and 6) commencing in September. We hope this maintains the high expectations we have for all our children in terms of school uniform and also gives the opportunity for the younger children to work on getting changed independently.

All children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be required to come to school in their PE kit on their PE days.

They will need to wear black shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms, a black zipped hoody, a new logo PE T shirt and black/white trainers. The school will be providing each child in these year groups, for this year only, their first PE T shirt. The children have already been measured up and will be given their new PE T Shirt before we break up.

The other items of PE kit are not to be branded items, these can be purchased from local supermarkets.

Additional PE T shirts can be purchased from PMG school shop in the town centre. If you lose the T Shirt the school has provided you with, it will be your responsibility to replace it.

All other year groups (Reception, Years 1 and 2) will still need to bring their PE kit to school to get changed into on their PE days. Their PE kit is a green round neck polo t shirt, black shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms, a black zipped hoody and black/white plain trainers. As they move up through the school into year 3, you will then be required to buy them a school logo PE T shirt.

# What Parents & Educators Need to Know about Ę C

Generative AI tools – such as ChatGPT – are now commonly used by children. In fact, 3 in 4 pupils in the 2024 Annual Literacy Survey reported using generative AI, up from just 2 in 5 the previous year. While these tools can boost learning and creativity, they also raise concerns around misinformation, privacy and overuse. This guide explores the key risks and how to support safe use.

WHAT ARE

THE RISKS?

Generative AI can sometimes produce faise or misleading content. Children – and even adults – may assume the information is accurate and trustworthy. This can affect learning and understanding of important topics. It's vital to teach children to critically assess all information, even whan it comes from AI. nformation, even when it comes from AI.

#### **EXPOSURE TO** INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

CENSORED

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Because generative AI is trained on vast datasets from across the internet, there is actasets from across the internet, there is a chance it may occasionally generate harmful or inappropriate content. Without supervision, children could encounter disturbing or unsuitable material. Active monitoring and clear usage boundaries can help reduce this risk. -1141 1

#### PRIVACY AND DATA SECURITY

IDEAS

Some AI tools ask for personal details or store users' interactions. If privacy settings are not correctly configured, children's personal data could be exposed or misused. Teaching good digital hygiene and setting strong privacy controls is essential for protecting children online. online.

#### REDUCED CRITICAL THINKING

Reiving too heavily on Al-generated responses may reduce children's willingness to think independently. If they consistently use Al to solve problems or complete tasks, it could impact their oblity to reason, analyse and form their own ideas. Encouraging thoughtful reflection is key.

#### DIGITAL DEPENDENCY

Regular use of generative AI can contribute to increased screen time and less real-world interaction. If left unmanaged, it may affect physical activity levels, sleep, and social development. Striking a healthy balance between online and offine activities is important for wellbeing.

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#### UNCLEAR ETHICAL BOUNDARIES

Children may not fully understand the ethical implications of using AI to complete homework or creative tasks. This can lead to unintentional plaglarism or dishonest academic practices. Conversations around responsible use and academic honesty are crucial.

# ESTABLISH CLEAR GUIDELINES

Set clear, age-appropriate rules for when and how generative AI cr used. Reinforce these regularly to help children develop a healthy, respectful and informed relationship with the technology.

#### PROMOTE ACTIVE SUPERVISION

Keep an eye on how the children in your care use Ai tools. Check in regularly to ensure they're using them appropriately and be ready to step in if something doesn't feel right.
