

Consultation on Admission Arrangements for 2027/28

27th October 2025 to 5th December 2025

As the Admitting Authority for Gusford Primary School, The Active Learning Trust (ALT) is seeking views on admission arrangements for the school year 2027/28. All schools within the ALT follow the Admissions Code and the law relating to admissions. This accords with the Trust's funding agreement with the Department for Education.

Suffolk County Council will continue to co-ordinate the admission arrangements for the normal year of entry (Reception) and ALT will continue to administer in-year applications and appeals. Parents wishing to apply for a school place outside of a normal year of entry should contact the school office for further information.

The current Published Admission Number (PAN) for Gusford Primary School is 90 students for each year group. The Active Learning Trust is seeking to reduce the PAN to 60, which would bring the PAN in line with numbers on roll for the last four years, and allow efficient budgeting, effective curriculum planning and ensure the correct level of staffing. Arrangements for when a school receives a higher number of applications than it has places available will remain the same, with the following over-subscription criteria being used to determine which pupils are allocated a place.

Children who have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) that names a specific school will be admitted. (Children with an EHCP that does not name the school will continue to be referred to the LA SEND Team to determine an appropriate place).

Children who have an EHCP fall outside the ordinary admissions system and therefore do not feature within the oversubscription criteria.

In the event of a year group being oversubscribed, and after the admission of pupils with an EHCP where the school is named, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the criteria set out below, in order:-

· A 'looked after child' or child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangements, or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of its social services functions (see definition in section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989.

This includes children who appear to the Admission Authority to have been in state care (i.e. in the care of or accommodated by a public authority, religious organisation or any other provider whose sole/main purpose is to benefit society) outside of England but ceased to be so as a result of being adopted only.

- · Children with a sibling attending the school at the time of application who is reasonably expected to still be attending the school at the proposed time of admission.
- · Other children by distance from the school with priority for admission being given to those who live nearest to the school as measured by a straight line.

As part of the consultation process, you are entitled to give your views on the proposed changes to the admission arrangements (namely in relation to the proposed reduction of PAN at Gusford from 90 to 60).

Responses must be received no later than noon on 5th December 2025.

Social Media and Messaging

In our PSHE lessons, we are doing everything we can to provide the children with information about on-line safety and give them a chance to discuss their use of social media. We are organising additional input from 4YP for upper KS2 children. However, most social media apps (Whatsapp, Instagram, Snapchat) have an age limit of 13 or above. This is not because they are difficult to use but because it is difficult for younger children to deal with the consequences of negative messaging. If a problem does arise, the Police and the Child Exploitation and On-line Centre (CEOPs) say that primary school children should not be using these platforms and state that it is a question of responsibility and parental ultimately safeguarding.

So with this advice in mind, please make sure you know what your child is doing on-line and who they are messaging. Our staff do not have the time or capacity during the school day to investigate on-line incidents. The fall-out is upsetting to your child which then impacts on their ability to focus on their learning in school.

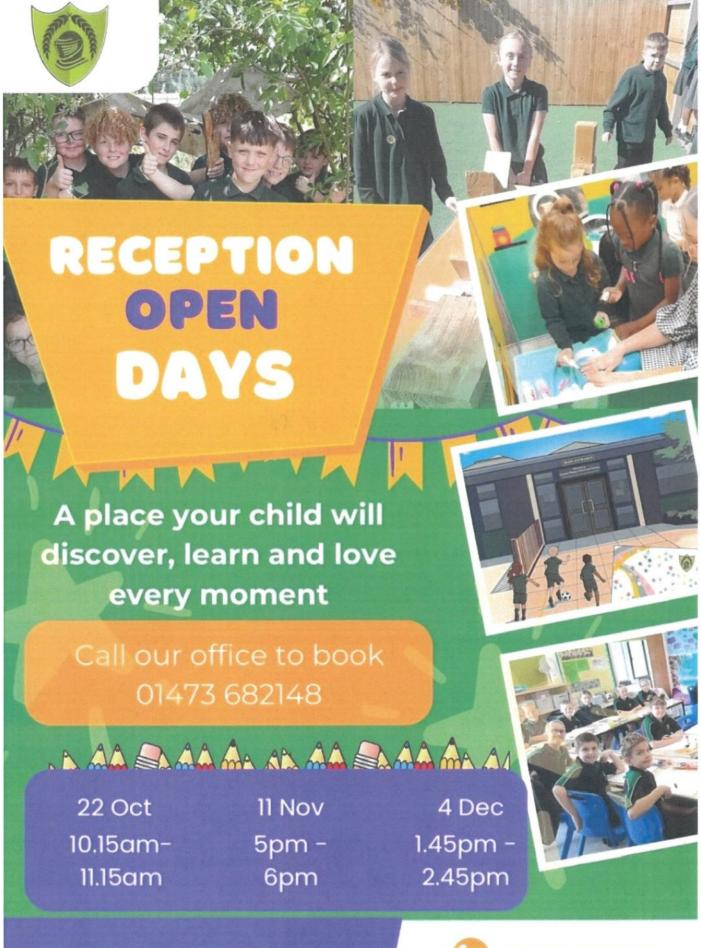

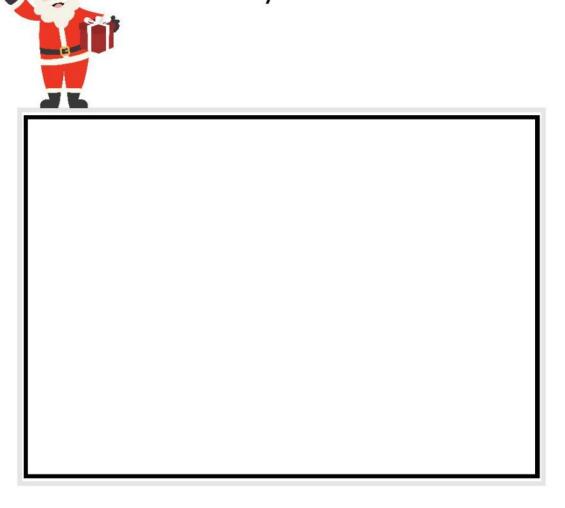
