How do you celebrate Bon Fire Night?

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We continue to learn about the Zones of Regulation as we find out about our feelings.

We will be using new words to describe our feelings and finding new ways to regulate ourselves.

The children will be learning how to share resources and take turns.

Communication and Language

Sharing ideas, feelings and experiences of Winter.

Learning key vocabulary linked to our topics.

Taking turns to share information and listen while working in Talk Partners.

Proud time—children will be explaining why they are proud of their work.

Physical Development

Fine Motor - The children will be learning how to roll, pinch and manipulate dough as they take part in Dough Disco.

Gross Motor— We will be taking part in big movements—all aimed at developing our core muscle strength.

PE— Children will use Balance Bikes over the term.

Literacy

Little Wandle Phonics sessions daily with both reading and writing development.

Key texts—

This term we will be reading Pumpkin Soup and learning about poetry using firework words.

Non Fiction Writing of lists—can you write a Christmas list to Santa?

Maths

We will be learning how to subitise numbers 1 to 5.

We will be learning about the composition of numbers 1 to 5.

Children will practice their accurate counting through games and rhymes.

The children be learning how to continue a simple pattern.

Understanding the World

RE— We will be learning about the Christian festival of Christmas.

History—We will be sharing our own experiences of Bon Fire Night celebrations.

Science—What happens in Winter?

DT—We will be baking hedgehog rolls.

Expressive Arts and Design

Art— The children will be exploring colour as they represent fireworks in the night sky.

Music— We will be learning the words to different songs from Wiggly Nativity.
