

The Pharoah Khufu was responsible for building the Great Pyramids.

Egyptians scribes (writers) wrote on papyrus.

Key Vocabulary			
Pharoah	Ruler of Egyptian Empire formed by Pharoah Narmer.	Rosetta Stone	Stone with three languages including hieroglyphics used to translate the ancient language.
Pyramid	Funeral monument build by pharaohs to house their tomb.	Burial chamber	The room inside a tomb with a stone sarcophagus where deceased bodies are placed.
The River Nile	River flowing through Egypt which is the longest river in Africa.	Antechamber	A large room in a tomb where offerings and precious objects were kept.
Cartouche	Stone oval with hieroglyphics showing a royal name.	Tutanhkhamun	Young pharaoh whose tomb became famous when it was excavated in 1922.
Hieroglyphics	A word, symbol or picture writing.	Papyrus	Thick paper made from reeds found on banks of River Nile.
