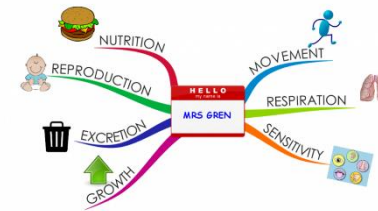
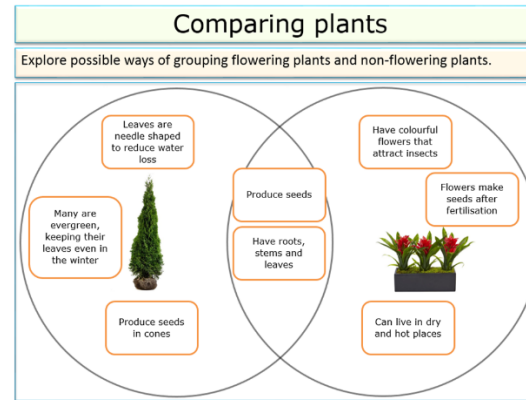
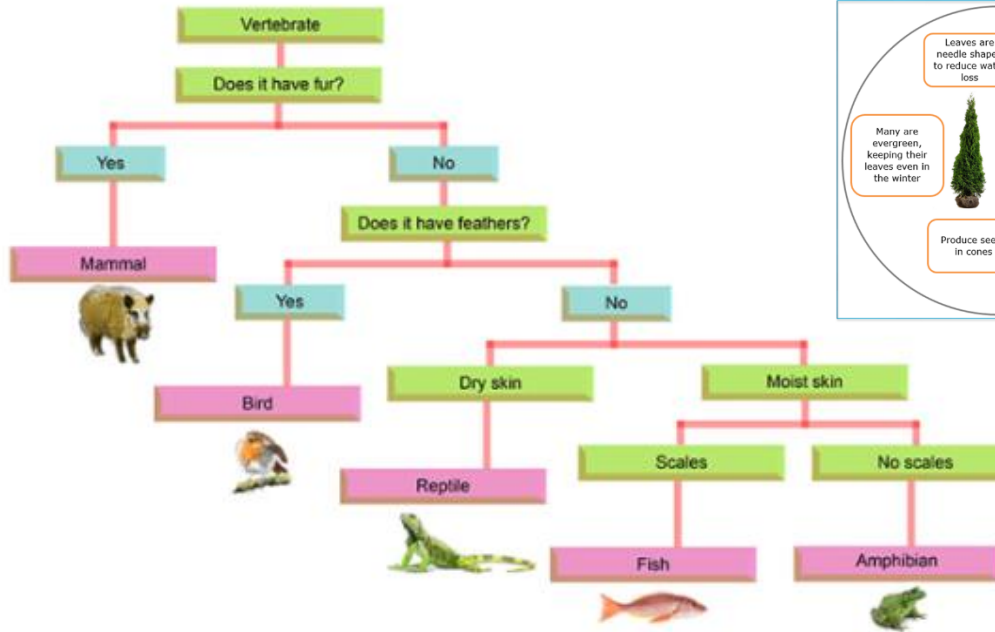




Year 4 - Summer 2 - Living Things & Their Habitats



Key Facts
A classification key is a way of grouping, identifying and naming living things.
Vertebrates can be sorted into 5 main groups: mammals, fish, birds, reptiles and amphibians.
There are many invertebrate groups and they include: snails and slugs, worms, spiders and insects.
Plants can be grouped into flowering and non-flowering.

Pollution	When the environment gets dirtied by waste, chemicals and other harmful substances.	Conservation	Protecting the environment and the wildlife that lives in it.
