Timeline

3rd Sept 1939- Britain and France declare war on Germany for invading Poland.

July 1940- Germany begins bombing attacks on Britain.

August 1940- Germany tries to destroy the RAF in the Battle of Britain.

Sept 1940-The Blitz starts as 300 German bombers attack the London docks.

Sep- Dec 1940-Many towns and cities are heavily bomber by German bombers.

Jan- May 1941- the Blitz continues.

June- Dec 1941- German bombers turn their attention to bombing Russia, bombing is Britain is less

1942 - 1944 - many important towns in Britain are bombed, V1 and V2 bombs are launched at Britain.

8th May 1945-Germany loses the war. Victory in Europe Day. There are hundreds of celebrations.

Important People

Neville Chamberlin- Prime Minister of Britain when war broke out in 1939.

Winston Churchill- became Prime Minister in in 1940 and led the country to victory.

Adolf Hitler- leader of the German Nazi party and a dictator of Germany. He murdered millions of people.

George VI- King of England, he stayed in London throughout the war.

Stalin- leader of Russia and an ally of Britain and America.

Franklin. D. Roosevelt- President of the USA and an ally of the UK.

Emperor Hirohito- Emperor of Japan during the war, part of the Axis powers

Charles De Gaulle- Leader of the Free French, a resistance movement in France during the war.
