PE and Sport Premium Achievement Outcomes and Spending

For the academic year 2017/18

During the academic year 2017/18, Gusford's aspiration is to continue to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach performance levels they are capable of.

Primary PE and Sport Premium

Rationale

The Primary PE and Sport Premium is government funding provided to schools to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. The government have committed to this funding until 2020. The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium is for:

"All pupils leaving primary school (to be) physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport."

At Gusford Primary School we share this vision and strive to use the funding to create a long lasting sporting legacy that will continue long after the Primary PE and Sport Premium. With this in mind, we aim to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of our PE and sport provision.

How much funding will we receive?

For the academic year 2017/18, Gusford Primary School will receive £10,055 (increasing over the year to approximately £22,000) in PE and sport premium.

How do we plan on spending the funding?

At Gusford Primary School we plan to use our funding in the following ways:

What impact will the premium have on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment?

The impact of how we spend our funding is evaluated termly against the following Six key indicators:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport
- 6. Encouraging healthy food choices

Completed termly, the tables below evaluate the strategies used by the school against the 6 key indicators and indicates the relative cost and impact of each.

Swimming

Gusford Primary.

For the 2017-2018 academic year there is a new requirement for schools to publish how many pupils within their Year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. By the end of Spring term 2018, 44 of our current Year 6 cohort, met these requirements. Those Year 6 pupils who have not yet met the requirements are due to attend further swimming lessons in the Summer term 2018. By the end of the Summer term 2018 54 pupils were able to meet these requirements.

Sports Premium funding for 2018/2019

We are expecting £21,080 in Sports Premium for 2018/2019. We also carried over some of last years funding as the appointment of a Sports Coach took place later in the year than planned (two coaches joined us in June 2018) so we hadn't spent all of the money allocated towards their employment costs by the end of the 2017/2018 school year. In addition £5889 of that carry forward was allocated to replace the Gym Trail equipment on the Junior playground to increase physical activity at playtimes and lunchtimes.
