



# Gusford Primary School

## Sports Premium Spending Plan 2018/19

During the academic year 2018/19, Gusford's aspiration is to continue to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach performance levels they are capable of. The implementation of our school sports coaches has helped the successful physical development of both the children and staff. This is something the school will continue to focus on into the new academic year.

### **Primary PE and Sport Premium**

The Primary PE and Sport Premium is government funding provided to schools to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium is for:

**"All pupils leaving primary school (to be) physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport."**

At Gusford Primary School we share this vision and strive to use the funding to create a long lasting sporting legacy that will continue long after the Primary PE and Sport Premium. With this in mind, we aim to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of our PE and sport provision.

### **How much funding will we receive?**

For the academic year 2018/189, Gusford Primary School will receive £21,080 in PE and sport premium. This is based on £16,000 lump sum plus £10 per pupil that were on roll in Year's 1 to 6 at the time of the school census in January 2018 (508 pupils).

### **How do we plan on spending the funding?**

At Gusford Primary School we plan to use our funding in the following ways:

### **What impact will the premium have on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment?**

The impact of how we spend our funding is evaluated termly against the following six key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport
6. Encouraging healthy food choices

The tables below evaluate the strategies used by the school against the 6 key indicators and indicates the relative cost and impact of each.

Key:

**Cost** – **red** (high over £200), **amber** (medium £200-£100) and **green** (low less than £100)

**Impact** – **red** (low), **amber** (medium) and **green** (high)

Whilst we aim to be as transparent as possible regarding our spending of the sports premium, were we to quote actual amounts of money, this would betray the confidentiality of some of our staff's salary. For this reason, we have used a colour coded system, (see explanatory key above).

## **Swimming 2018-2019**

There is a requirement for schools to publish how many pupils within their Year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently. At the end of the Summer Term 2019:

- Thirty six percent of the current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
- Seventy two percent of the current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- Sixty percent of the current Year 6 cohort are able to use a range of strokes effectively. For example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.
