At Hallam Primary School, we want children to feel proud to attend Hallam and school uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of a school. We believe that wearing a school uniform plays an important part in;

- Ensuring that children are dressed appropriately for school activities.
- Contributing to a feeling of pride amongst the children in school.
- Looking smart and gives a sense of belonging.
- Eliminating social problems caused by the latest fashion fads.
- Making children feel equal to peers in terms of appearance.
- Improving behaviour through creating a working environment with improved concentration and discipline.
- Supporting children's well-being (promoting pride, self-confidence, and belonging along with reducing the stress of deciding what to wear)

School Dress Code

All pupils at Hallam School are expected to wear standard school dress, this can be with the school logo or plain.

Hallam School Dress Consists of:

Royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan
Dark jogging bottoms, leggings, trousers or skirts
Gingham or pinafore dress (in blue and white)
White polo t-shirt with collar

Shoes:

Sensible dark coloured shoes. These can be smart shoes, trainers or boots. Preferably black or navy (no flip flops, sandals or heels).

Note: There is no expectation for children to wear traditional school shoes on the days that they do not do PE lessons – children can wear black trainers any day of the week. We are also realistic that trainers that have no logo on are quite hard to find. If the trainers are predominantly dark (blue or black), this is acceptable.

PE:

Children are asked to come in their PE kit on PE days.

PE kit consists of:

Dark shorts

Dark jogging bottoms or leggings (plain, no logos or stripes)

T-Shirt in house colour:

Redmires = **Red**, Hallamshire = **Blue**, Lodge Moor = **Yellow** & Fulwood = **Green**

Royal blue fleece or sweatshirt

Trainers

It is advisable to mark all uniform items with your child's name.

Thank you for supporting our school uniform policy and encouraging our children to take pride in their uniform and appearance.

False nails

Children are not allowed to wear false nails in school. If you wish for your child to have their nails done, please do this during the holidays.
