Safeguarding at Hallwood Park

What is Safeguarding?

Safeguarding means keeping you safe, happy and healthy so you can learn and enjoy school. It means we will:

- Protect you from harm
- Help you if you feel worried or unsafe
- Make sure you are cared for and respected
- Teach you how to stay safe in school, online and in the community



Who Keeps You Safe?

All adults in school help keep you safe. Some staff have special jobs:

- Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL): Ms Graham
- Deputy DSLs: Miss Binks and Mr Wood

If you are worried, you can talk to **any adult you trust** – or one of these people.



What might make a child unsafe?

- Being hurt physically or emotionally
- Being bullied (in person or online)
- Not being looked after properly
- Someone saying or doing things that make you feel uncomfortable
- Seeing or receiving unsafe messages or pictures online

Bullying

At Hallwood Park we use STOP IT to explain bullying:

Several Times On Purpose, creating an Imbalance of power, that is Targeted

Bullying is never OK. If it happens, speak up straight away – we will listen and help.
