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Our topic this half term: The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch

Our book this half term: The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch by David and Ronda Armitag:

English	In English this half term, our focus text of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' will marry nicely with our history topic all about lifeboats! We will be focusing on detailed observational descriptions of settings and objects through the use of rich vocabulary. We are going to be learning our story using our 'Talk 4 Writing' approach, to then write our own versions of the story.	(ABC)
Maths	In maths this half term, we will be consolidating our time learning from the previous term which will bring us nicely to our new topics, place value to 100 and addition and subtraction. We are working to build our fluency in maths, focusing on a mastery approach to build understanding and confidence. Together we will discover how to represent our Maths using concrete resources, drawings and more abstract methods.	2+3=5
Science	Living things and their habitats is our Science focus this half term. As Scientists we will; ask questions about what living things have in common, classify objects into groups, match animals and plants to their habitats, recognise how animals and plants depend on each other_and show the order of a food chain. We will embed this topic further by carrying our our own research and investigations.	
PSHE/RSE	This half term we will be reflecting on 'Being Me in My World' and focusing on us! We will look at hopes and fears as well as who to ask for help when we feel worried. We will learn what the meaning of a right and responsibility is and will learn how to help to make our class a safe and fair space. We will recognise the choices we make and understand the consequences, following our Hambleton Way!	
RE	We will be discussing and exploring the key question 'Is it possible to be kind to everyone all of the time?' through the religion of Christianity. We will support children's voice, opinions and personal experiences as well as sharing Christian stories with morals relating to our key question.	\$\$\$ C \$†
PE	During Autumn term we will be focusing on games. Children will improve and apply their basic Fundamental Movement Skills in games. They will play games that demand simple choices and decisions on how to use space to avoid opponents, keep the ball and score points.	CO
History	As Historians, we will be enquiring about the impact of lifeboats in our local area of Blackpool. By delving into the past, we will be investigating the development of lifeboats through timelines, images and historical evidence, linking this with the significant figure of Grace Darling and the main founder of lifeboats, Sir William Hillary.	
DT	In music, we will be exploring the topics of animals and story time. This links in nicely with our science topic this term (animals including humans) and our continued endeavour to become story tellers in reading and writing,	\$
