Our topic this half term: Industrial Revolution - Our class of the revolution!

Our books this half term: History Hunters, Victorian Venture, Oliver Twist, Mill Girl, The Bobbin Girl, Street Child, Queen Victoria: The woman who ruled the world, The industrial revolution for kids, A Victorian mill, The Victorians.

English	Using a range of inspiring, informative and gripping texts we will be exploring the history of the Industrial Revolution in Britain. We will be using texts to model our own work of as writers and illustrators in our first term as Year 3's. We will focus our work around our class text which we have voted on.	(ABC)
Maths	The topics covered during Autumn term will be; Place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division. Throughout these areas we will always be looking to use and apply these skills in real life situations. We will also continue to work on recalling our times tables (2,3,5,10, before introducing 4,8), as these are key to both an understanding of Math and confidence in the subject.	2+3=5
Science	As scientists we will learning about movement and nutrition. We will develop the knowledge of: the role of a skeleton, know the main bones in our body, how bones are used for movement, how food is an energy source for animals, identify main nutrient groups and explain a balanced diet.	
PSHE/RSE	We will start our learning by building up our knowledge and skills of resilience, one of our school's drivers. We need to work on this as we enter Key Stage 2 and understand that it is a key part of life. Our second topic this half term will be 'Being me in my world'. We will focus on rights and responsibilities of being part of a class, building upon doing the right thing and understanding that there are consequences.	
RE	In RE this half term, our religion will be Hinduism and we will be investigating the question: Would celebrating Diwali at home and in the community bring a feeling of belonging to a Hindu child? We will explore Diwali and how Hindus celebrate this as part of their beliefs.	(C\$+)
PE	We will become dancers! We will improvise and translate ideas from a stimulus as well as learning a short sequence, we will perform on our own and in a group, we will change the dynamics, space and relationships within a short dance and learn travel, gestures, turns, jumps and balances to prepare us for the Olympics Summer '28. History	As Historians we are going to look at how life changed for children in North West during the Industrial revolution. We will learn about the cotton industry asking questions whether things have changed for better or worse, compare photos and create a timeline of the great inventions of the Industrial Revolution.	
Music	This half term we will be following our music scheme, Music Express. We will be looking at the unit 'In the Past' whereby the focus will be on pitch. We will compose 3 note melodies. We will also look at the unit 'Communication' whereby we will learn to make music inspired by technology.	\$
DT	In DT this half term, we will be learning about structures and mechanisms through wood work. We will be learning how to design, make, use tools safely and evaluate our finished piece of woodwork, which will be our own recreations of a factory from the industrial revolution era.	
French	This half term we will be continuing to introduce children to the French language. The children will look at greetings, colours and numbers.	

Our enrichment this half term: We will be settling into Year 3 and Key Stage 2 and understanding the importance of independence and resilience.
