







English	<p>In English this half term, the children will focus their reading and writing around our theme of people fighting for their rights. We will produce various pieces of writing, these will include a diary, letter and a story. There are lots of lovely opportunities for cross-curricular writing in this unit, as we will link our writing to our History topic about the Suffragettes. We will be focussing on how to use fronted adverbial phrases, expanded noun-phrases and modify adjectives and prepositional phrases. Our class read will be the book, 'The Closest Thing to Flying'. Other reads will include a book from the Little People, Big Dreams collection about Emmeline Pankhurst and 'Fantastically Great Women Who Changed the World'.</p>	
Maths	<p>The areas that will be covered this half-term are: place value and addition and subtraction. Throughout these areas we will always be looking to use and apply these skills in real life situations. We will also continue to learn our times tables throughout our fluency time in lessons. We will focus on place value up to 10,000 and how to represent, partition and estimate using these numbers. We will also begin work on Roman Numerals, where children will learn to recognise and write these numbers. We will also learn to add and subtract 4-digit numbers, both with exchanges and no exchanges.</p>	
Science	<p>In Science this term, we will be learning all about Animals Including Humans. We will be learning about the human digestive system, and we will be able to name the parts and describe each function. We will also learn about the different types of teeth in the human body, before moving onto using food chains to identify producers, predators and prey.</p>	

<p>PSHE/RS E</p>	<p>This term our PSHE topic is 'Relationships', we will be learning all about friendships, relationships, issues within relationships and how to deal with these situations. We will be celebrating relationships in our life.</p>	
<p>RE</p>	<p>In RE, we will be learning all about the religion of Buddhism. We will be learning about the life of Buddha and whether it is possible for everyone to be happy.</p>	
<p>PE</p>	<p>In PE we will be focussing on dance and will be performing dance routines. We will be preparing for our very exciting dance show.</p>	
<p>French</p>	<p>This term we will be focussing on the topic of 'Presenting Myself'. The children will learn how to introduce themselves by saying their name, age, where they live and how they feel in French. They will also learn the French numbers up to 20.</p>	
<p>History</p>	<p>This term we will be learning all about the Suffragette movement and how they campaigned for women's voting rights. We will start off by looking at how voting has evolved from the 19th Century to the modern day. Our historical figure we will look at is of course, Emmeline Pankhurst! We will learn about notable points of her life and why she was so significant. As part of our topic, we will also debate whether the Suffragettes were right to break the law.</p>	
<p>Music</p>	<p>In Music this half term, we will be completing a unit called, 'Back to the Feature'. We will be learning pieces of classical music such as, Mozart's Rondo Alla Turca. We will learn specific vocabulary such as, crotchet, crotchet rest and ostinato.</p>
