Maths	<p>In our Maths this half term we will first be looking at Multiplication and Division following the White Rose Maths scheme of work. The children will be focusing on; Multiply up to a 4-digit number by a 1-digit number, multiply a 2-digit number by a 2-digit number using the area model, multiply a 2-digit number by a 2-digit number, multiply a 3-digit number by a 2-digit number, multiply a 4-digit number by a 2-digit number, solve problems with multiplication, short division, divide a 4-digit number by a 1-digit number, divide with remainders, efficient division and solve problems with multiplication and division</p> <p><b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To research the Vigesimal number system and consider how Anglo Saxons used this. Could you create a set of sums, visually represented in the Vigesimal number system?</p>	
Science	<p>In our Science this half term we will be focusing on "Properties of Materials" In this unit we will begin to explain why materials are used for different purposes, investigate which materials are soluble in water, suggest ways in which different mixtures can be separated and identify if a change is easily reversible and how to reverse it. We will also investigate the hardness of materials and place them in order of hardness.</p> <p><b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To grow and observe Anglo-Saxon crops like wheat, barley, and beans to learn about their agriculture and daily life.</p>	
PSHE/RSE	<p>In our PSHE/RSE lessons this half term we will be looking at "Celebrating Differences", where we will look at the identity of people, Racism, Rumours and Name Calling, Types of Bullying and Does Money Matter?</p> <p><b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To explore and discuss Anglo-Saxon values like loyalty, courage, and community, and relate them to personal and social behaviour in modern life."</p>	
RE	<p>In our RE this half term, we will be asking the big question "Are Sikh stories important today?" The children will be looking at Sikh stories and how they link to the modern teaching and values of the Sikh religion. During this unit, we will discuss which stories are special to us and why they are special. We will then look closely at some of the traditional stories which are taught to Sikh's and make links to stories that we know from different religions and teachings.</p> <p><b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To Investigate the impact of Christianity on Anglo-Saxon beliefs and practices, exploring how it shaped their worldview and influenced their culture."</p>	
PE	<p>In PE this term, we will be doing Net and Wall skill. They will start by learning the forehand shot and then move on to practicing backhand shots. They will then learn how to direct the ball to their partner and continue a rally. In the later lessons, they will be introduced to simple tactics in a net-type game, such as hitting the ball away from their partner. Finally, they will play a game and use their tactics to score points.</p> <p><b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To Create and write the rules for a game themed around the Anglo Saxons.</p>	
French	<p>In our French lesson this half term, we will be completing our 'At the Cafe' topic. Over the course of the half term the children will be creating their own breakfast menus in French and then running their own French cafe in the classroom which I'm hoping will involve getting some real food in one week. They will learn how to order food at the cafe, very useful for anyone going on holiday to France this summer!</p> <p><b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To learn basic Anglo-Saxon vocabulary and phrases in French, and use them to create a short presentation or role-play about Anglo-Saxon life.</p>	
Music	<p>In our music this half term, we will be continuing to work on learning our Brass Instruments. These are peripatetic music lessons provided by the Lancashire Music.</p> <p><b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To Compose and perform original music inspired by Anglo-Saxon instruments, melodies, and the themes of their legends and myths."</p>	



DT	In DT this half term, we will be designing a stuffed toy, considering the main component shapes required and creating an appropriate template. We will also create strong and secure blanket stitches and use applique to apply pieces to apply pieces of fabric decoration.	
	<b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To <b>Design</b> and create a model of an Anglo-Saxon longhouse or a piece of functional Viking-style jewellery using traditional materials and techniques.	
History	In our History lessons this half term, we are focusing on the Anglo-Saxons. We will kick off the new term by having a workshop about the Anglo-Saxons and then we will look at what Britain was like before the Anglo-Saxons, we will then look at where the Anglo-Saxons came from and where they decided to settle.	
	<b>Project On a Page Idea:</b> To Create a timeline of key events and figures in Anglo-Saxon history, and present findings through a museum exhibit, a historical drama, or a digital presentation.
