Key Stage 1 History Objectives

- Changes within living memory. Where appropriate, these should be used to reveal aspects of change in national life.
- Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally (e.g. the Great Fire of London, the first aeroplane flight or events commemorated through festivals or anniversaries)
- The lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. Some should be used to compare aspects of life in different periods (e.g. Elizabeth 1 and Queen Victoria; Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong; William Caxton and Tim Berners-Lee; Pieter Breugel the Elder and LS Lowry; Rosa Parks and Emily Davison; Mary Seacole and / Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell)
- Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality
