Key Stage 1 RE Objectives

Pupils should be taught to:

- A. Know about and understand a range of religions and world views
 - 1. Recall and name different beliefs and practises, including festivals, worship, rituals and ways of life, in order to find out about the meanings behind them.





- 2. Retell and suggest meanings to some religious and moral stories, exploring and discussing sacred writings and sources of wisdom and recognising the traditions from which they come.
- 3. Recognise some different symbols and actions which express a community's way of life, appreciating some similarities and differences.
- B. Express ideas and insights about the nature, significance and impact of religions and worldview.
 - 4. Ask and respond to questions about what individual and communities do, and why, so that pupils can identify what difference belonging to a community might make.
 - 5. Observe and recount different ways of expressing identity and responding sensitively for themselves
 - 6. Notice and respond sensitively to some similarities between different religions and world views.
- C. Gain and deploy the skills needed to engage seriously with religions and world views.
 - 7. Explore questions about belonging, meaning and truth so that they can express their own ideas and opinions in response using words, music, art or poetry.
 - 8. Find out about and respond with ideas to examples of co-operation between people who are different.
 - 9. Find out about questions of right and wrong and begin to express their ideas and opinions in response.
