Early Years Foundation Stage Objectives

16-26 months

- 1. Listens to and enjoys rhythmic patterns in rhymes and stories.
- 2. Enjoys rhymes and demonstrates listening by trying to join in with actions or vocalisations.
- 3. Rigid attention may appear not to hear

22-36 months



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- 1. Listens with interest to the noises adults make when they read stories.
- 2. Recognises and responds to many familiar sounds, e.g. turning to a knock on the door, looking at or going to the door.
- 3. Shows interest in play with sounds, songs and rhymes.
- 4. Single channelled attention. Can shift to a different task if attention fully obtained using child's name helps focus.

30-50 months

- 1. Listens to others one to one or in small groups, when conversation interests them.
- 2. Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.
- 3. Joins in with repeated refrains and anticipates key events and phrases in rhymes and stories.
- 4. Focusing attention still listen or do, but can shift own attention.
- 5. Is able to follow directions (if not intently focused on own choice of activity).

40-60 months

- 1. Maintains attention, concentrates and sits quietly during appropriate activity.
- 2. Two-channelled attention can listen and do for short span.

ELG

- 1. Children listen attentively in a range of situations.
- 2. They listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events and respond to what they hear with relevant comments, questions or actions.
- 3. They give their attention to what others say and respond appropriately, while engaged in another activity.
