Checklist:

- ⇒ Check your friends list – do you know everyone?
- ⇒ Delete random friend requests
- ⇒ Think before you post online
- ⇒ Set your Privacy settings to friends only
- ⇒ Don't give out personal information
- ⇒ Never arrange to meet in person someone you have 'met' online
- ⇒ Tell someone! Report abuse! Don't respond! Don't delete!

If you are worried about anything you have seen online, or done online – speak to your parents / carers, or any member of staff.

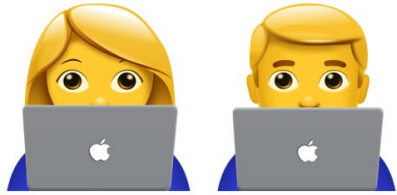

- Try to ignore the person – block them if you can
- Keep all messages as evidence

Do NOT:

- Keep it to yourself
- Be unkind back
- Delete the messages
- Allow the person to keep being unkind
