
Where do we live and how has it changed?

Key Vocabulary:	
urban	A busy locations which has lots of houses and usually shops and offices.

map symbols	A small picture on a map to tell you about something. There are symbols for schools, churches, post offices and pubs.
Landmarks	An object or feature of a landscape or town that is easily seen and recognized from a distance, especially one that enables someone to establish their location.
Address	Locates exactly where someone lives by having the house number, town or city name and postcode.
