

The two topics we will cover in the remainder of the Autumn term are:

- Which birds and plants would Peter Rabbit find in our park?
- Why are humans not like tigers?

We will be reading and learning to retell the stories Jack and the Beanstalk, The Gigantic Turnip by Aleksei Tolstoy, The Tiger Who Came To Tea by Judith Kerr and One Snowy Night by Christina Butler.

English: oral rehearsal of captions and simple sentences, full stops, capital letters, finger spaces, beginning to read back work to check.

Maths: addition, subtraction, number bonds, part part whole, comparing numbers (within 10).

Science: observe and knowing about changes in seasons, name the seasons and know about the type of weather in each season, asking scientific questions, using simple equipment to make observations, carrying out simple tests, identify and classify things, explain to others what I find out, using simple data, know and name a variety of animals, classify animals by what they eat, name the parts of a human I can see, link body parts to senses.

RE: Who is a Christian and what do they believe? Places of worship.

PSHE: keeping safe, e - safety, healthy lifestyles, bullying and wellbeing. PE: dance, gymnastics.

Art and Design/Design and Technology: portraits, printing, Austin's Butterfly, William Morris, clay.

Computing: recording, retrieving and play back.

English Speaking Board is designed to improve communication by developing speaking and listening skills. We will be presenting show and tell linked to what we are learning about. We will also be reciting a poem every half term which will be on the website and on ClassDojo to practise at home.
