

We are excited that our extra-curricular clubs after school have once again recommenced. Please note that there will be no charge for children who are eligible for Pupil Premium as their funding allocation will cover the cost of the club.

Please ensure you are signed up to Class Dojo to communicate with your child's class teacher, as this is the main form of communication between home and school. Staff check Class Dojo daily and will respond appropriately to messages or queries in a timely way during the hours of 8:30 and 4:30, but please be mindful that staff are teaching the children, so may not respond instantly to your message. If your message or query is urgent, please contact the school office who will inform the Class Teacher. Thank you to all of our parents who use Class Dojo in this way. However, a very small minority of our parents have begun to use this platform to vent their frustrations towards the school or staff members, which is completely inappropriate and also unfair for staff to receive outside of working hours.











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We welcome any feedback and the opportunity to respond to your queries or your frustrations, but ask if you would please make an appointment via the school office so we can deal with them in the correct way. If your child is going to be absent from school, you must inform the school office per our Attendance Policy and inform them of the reason for the absence.

We are continuing to raise money to improve our playground for your children. We have further exciting fundraising activities planned for this year that your child can take part in. We are also introducing our own School Lottery to support our fundraising, so please encourage your friends and family to sign up to it as every ticket sold results in a donation into the school playground fund. We also have a voluntary school fund donation of £1 per week, which you can make through parent pay to support 'wow' activities in the classroom such as visits from the Animal Man, living eggs, live caterpillars and many more.
