
All the pupils have worked hard this term and are excited for our next topic, which is "come and join the celebration."

They support the 'hard-to-reach' projects; those causes that do not receive the platform or funding that they probably deserve. They aim to support over 36 projects per year, and to reach out to all corners of our city to remind people how great Birmingham is.

We were so excited to be successful and we've asked Sovereign to supply new play equipment. We're hoping that it can be installed soon.



Even if your child has a packed lunch it's worth registering for free school meals.

Are you entitled?

This is because the school gets £1,300 of extra money for every pupil on free school meals and we use this money to buy extra things for pupils like speech and language therapy and resources.

It also means that if your child is isolating due to covid you'll get vouchers from the school and in the holidays the Government and the Council have been paying for vouchers as well.

If your employment situation has changed or you've not let us know before that you're on benefits it's definitely worth looking into. If you claim:

- **Income Support**
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The quaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided the parents are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax credit
- Universal Credit for those applying on or after 1 April 2018, their household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits they get)

You will be eligible for free school meals. Please let school know and bring in or send in proof of benefits.
