Proposal regarding further possible expansion

In January there will be an opportunity for parents to come into school and talk to members of the Local Authority to give their thoughts, or ask questions, on the proposal for Hamilton to temporarily expand to include Years 7 and 8 of a secondary provision. The proposed date for this will be January 23rd. Further information regarding this will be sent out at the beginning of the Spring Term. We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at these meetings.
