

COVID management

Now that restrictions have all been lifted we will be doing what we can to ensure we are doing all we can to stop any possible outbreaks of COVID-19 in school. This will allow children the opportunity to have up close experiences of a range of animals they may not otherwise encounter. This is something we are hoping the whole school will be able to access. In addition to opportunities like these we are beginning to do school trips again.

Trips out of school are a good way for children to learn outside the school environment and also a way for them to build on important life skills such as independence. If you would not like your child to go out of school on trips then please make sure you let us know

Sensory Room Consultation

We want to update our sensory room to make it more useable for a larger range of students so we're asking staff what they would like to see in the room.

We've had some great ideas back so far:

Cause and effect toys, lights that are dimmed, music chimes, cushions or beanbags, toys with laces/buttons/ Velcro, plush toys, wall lights for touch.

Lights on ceiling, bubble tube, large cushions, projector with option to change scene e.g under the sea, beach, cave!


Interactive floor projector.
Cause and effect wall

Mood lighting, wall and floor projections, music, and aromas that can transport students from the deep blue sea to the outskirts of space

Responsive projection e.g balloons on the floor to pop. moving/falling items to drop and fall on pipes for example. Sufficient storage and organization for groupwork resources. Soft 'chairs' for pupils to observe and regulate from. Sensory toy box of sturdy cause and effect toys specifically for the sensory room.
