The beginning of the Summer Term has gone well at Hamilton. ### **Expansion - Secondary**

In this half term's newsletter I thought it would be a good opportunity for me to give an update on Hamilton's expansion. As you should all be aware we have made a temporary change to the age range of the school meaning that in September we will have three Year 7 classes. This is a very exciting opportunity for us. Very soon we will be expecting the temporary building to be put in place at the back of the playground. We are in discussions with landscapers regarding redesigning some of the other outdoor areas we have which are not currently used, to create more outdoor space for those children in Primary to replace the space taken by the temporary building.

With regards to the curriculum for the secondary pupils we are in the process of developing an exciting curriculum that will prove to be both inspirational and aspirational. This is really exciting work and we are visiting lots of schools currently to look at the provision they offer in order to ensure we are putting in place the best possible curriculum for our pupils.

Look out for further updates regarding a permanent secondary department for Hamilton. More information on this will be coming soon!!

### **Expansion - Primary**

In January we had 6 new pupils join the school and have had a couple of further pupils join this half term. This resulted in an extra classroom in the form of the Portakabin which is currently situated at the back of the school. We have an old caretaker's house on site which is not currently in use. Over the Summer this will be knocked down and over the next 12-18 months (hopefully!) we will see a new extension to the Primary site. This will replace the Portakabin and add an additional classroom. This room would not be with the intention of taking in further pupils but used to reduce the numbers in some of Key Stage 2 classes which will be hugely beneficial to all pupils. We are also hoping this new build will include a new and better sensory room as well as a second floor with more meeting spaces for EHCP reviews and a long awaited staff room. We do not currently have a space for staff and this is very much needed.

There are lots of exciting plans for Hamilton and the Secondary expansion is proving to benefit the Primary site as well. We continue, as ever to ensure we are providing the best quality of education for our pupils as possible.

### Staff changes

This half term we have welcomed some new members of staff. As welcome additions to our teams we have a new teacher, Maxine, and some new Teaching Assistants, Toni, Namrata and Sujan. We have also welcomed Bakhtawar back from her maternity leave. After half term we have another Teaching Assistant returning from maternity leave and will welcome yet another Teaching Assistant, Kelly Ann. We are continually growing the team and it's lovely to have some fresh faces in the school!

At the end of June we will be losing Simon, our Network Manager. He is off to pastures new and we wish him all the best in his new job at Oscott Manor.

### Finally

Next half term will be a busy one with Sports Day and we are also currently beginning to organise the Year 6 leavers/ graduation celebrations. We also have the end of the exciting Arts Project that we have been involved in as part of the Cooperative Trust. More information on all of these exciting events will be handed out after half term so look out for this!!

The children in class 3 have loved learning all about their topic 'Pirates'. In English we have explored sensory books where we found maps, shiny coins and lots of treasure. In Science, we explored water and sand and how items can sink or float.

This half term class 4 have been learning all about sea creatures with our topic "Under the Sea". We have been exploring sea creatures and have been very creative in our art lessons, making our own newspaper sharks, jellyfish with wobbly legs and walking crabs!











This term our topic has been 'Under the Sea'. What better way to explore this than reading 'Under The Sea' by Anna Milbourne. The class have loved the weird and wonderful creatures that we have read about such as a sea cow. The children have created some fabulous art pieces too! We have created our own sea creatures. We have delved into both fiction and fiction elements of the sea as we have also had fun learning about mermaids.











Class 6 has really enjoyed the first rays of sunshine in Summer term 1. Our topic for this term was 'Under the Sea' children learned all about the sea, animals, different habitats and water inspired lessons. In English, children enjoyed reading 'Speedy Shark' and 'We're going swimming' books. In Maths, children enjoyed counting fishes, giving fishes, posting seashells and "magnetic fishing" games. Our entire Science lessons were water based with experiments such as, 'fizzy water grapes', 'walking water' and 'fizzy sea, chalk, lemon, lime and sea oil". During our Understanding of the World lessons, children went on various animal hunts ranging from farm animals to pets. Children have had an amazing role-play lesson for the King's Coronation where they dressed up as the King and had a tea party. This term we have also celebrated children's Birthdays, Class 6 definitely loves a slice of cake! Well done to all Children in Class 6 for being such a fun and hardworking

We have had a 'whale of a time' this half term learning about our topic 'Under the Sea'. The children have enjoyed reading the '5 Little Mermaids' book in English and learning about the different oceans and animals. In Art, we have made lots of sea animal crafts and we have done some finger painting, collaging and weaving. The children especially enjoyed making paper plate turtles.

In cooking, we have made lots of different dishes including starfish sandwiches and sea creature biscuits.

Our topic this half term has been 'Pirates'. We have had fun completing lots of different activities relating to this topic.

In Art sessions they made some Boats, Pirates, jewellery boxes and collages. We also did some Pirate themed dressing up and sensory play exploring with jewellery.

In Cooking pupils explored different textures of food through sensory trays, made sandwiches, wraps, pizzas, cheese twists, decorating cakes and biscuits.

We also carried on going shopping each week to buy some ingredients for our cooking lessons, the children have explored the new environments and in shop helped to find items from our shopping list.

This term our topic has been "Under the Sea". We have been learning about different sea animals and key facts about the oceans around us.

In Class 12 we have been learning about 'Space and Sea'. We have learnt lots about the different Oceans in the World and the Planets in our Solar System. In Science we looked at floating and sinking and even made our own miniature rafts.

This half term we have been on lots of adventures. We went to Aston Villa to take part in a football tournament, we also went to the Safari Park to see lots of animals and even ride some rides.





This term our theme has been 'Pirates'. We have enjoyed making pirate hats and faces. In cooking we have been practicing key skills such as chopping, mixing and grating. We have had lots of fun during our Forest School sessions, making a tepee, planting potatoes, making bird seed cakes and planting watercress seeds. We had a great time during our class trip to Sandwell Valley Park. We explored the forest and found lots of minibeasts. We also enjoyed playing in the Sandwell Valley playground and had a lovely picnic on the grass.
