



Home Learning - LKS2 Autumn 1

Pick your adventure! Choose one, try a few, or invent an idea of your own. These activities are optional and are all about exploring, creating and enjoying learning together.

Write

Step into prehistoric Britain. Write a diary entry, story, letter or comic strip from the viewpoint of a child living in the Stone, Bronze or Iron Age. What might they eat, do, see or worry about?

Bring in: your finished piece of writing or comic strip.



Create

Create prehistoric-inspired art using cave-style images, patterns, animals or settlement scenes. Use pencils, paint, charcoal, collage or natural materials.

Bring in: your finished artwork, with a title.



Research

Become an expert on one area of prehistory - perhaps Stonehenge, hunter-gatherers, farming, tools, hill forts, food, clothing or beliefs.

Bring in: a fact file, poster, information booklet or mini display.



Make

Build a model Stone, Bronze or Iron Age settlement using recycled or natural materials. Include homes and think about food, water, animals, tools and safety.

Bring in: your labelled model settlement.

OUR BIG QUESTION

How did life change from the Stone Age to the Iron Age?

Investigate

Collect a small selection of rocks with an adult. Compare and sort them by colour, texture, shape, pattern or hardness. Extra challenge: explain how a fossil forms.

Bring in: a labelled rock collection or rock-sorting chart.



Explore

With an adult, walk locally or study a map. Choose where you would build a prehistoric settlement and explain how water, shelter, land, food, resources or high ground influenced your choice.

Bring in: an annotated map showing your chosen site.



Compare

Choose one part of everyday life - homes, food, clothes, tools, travel, farming or childhood. Compare prehistoric life with life today.

Bring in: a comparison chart, fold-out, mini-book or labelled diagram.

Your Idea

Surprise us! Invent your own way to explore our big question. You could create a game, timeline, mini museum, artefact, model or another idea.

Bring in: your finished creation, ready for our gallery.
