4th December with the last posting day as Monday 18th December.


We request that specific details are on the front of the envelope in order for sorting to be easier for the Year 6 children. Please ensure there is: the child's full name (if known), year group and class name.



Did you know...

If your child finishes the year with **95% attendance** they will still have missed 10 school days, which equates to around **55 hours of learning time**?

In fact, if your child misses just one day in the week it equates to them missing **20%**, with their weekly attendance sitting at just **80%**.

Red came back to Hanslope to talk to the children and read them her latest book 'Ho Ho Ho! A Pirate's Christmas for me'. She was very engaging and the children had a wonderful time learning about how and why she became an author and the problems she overcame. She read her new book to them and then answered questions. The children enjoyed her new book and many bought a copy for themselves! The Reading Ambassadors have written a piece to tell you more:

Author visits Hanslope Primary School

On Wednesday 22nd November, an author visited our school. Her name is Jennifer, but she goes by the name: Red. She spoke to the children in KS1, Year 3 and Year 4. Red used to learn at Hanslope Primary School. When she became older, and when in secondary education, she got diagnosed with dyslexia. She had a hard time at school because she knew she would not be able to make it as a writer in her wildest dreams because she could not spell. When she realised she just needed to try, she climbed to the top and achieved her goal! She showed lots of determination and resilience. When she was younger and in Beech class, she remembered she loved all the opportunities to let her imagination run free when writing. Also, she remembered making a tea towel in art for her parents to buy!

Red writes equally for adults and children. All her books are interesting and inspiring. As a child, Red's first story was called 'Red's Rainbow'. The theme and message was self-belief and being proud of who you are. Her first published bookthat has come out in October 2023- is called 'Ho, Ho, Ho! A Pirate's Christmas for me'. One of her other books is called 'Unicake.'

We all enjoyed the opportunity to hear from a published author. She gave us lots of inspiration and reminders of her visit in a poster or book form. Who knowsmaybe there is a published author of the future lurking in our classrooms-just like Red was?
