Did you know...

If your child finishes the year with 95% attendance they will still have missed 10 school days, which equates to around 55 hours of learning time?

In fact, if your child misses just one day in the week it equates to them missing 20%, with their weekly attendance sitting at just 80%.

They used i-pads to look at a 3D sketch of Skara Brea; a ruin of the Stone Age, did a word search and used a dictionary to look up any new or unfamiliar words and they looked at existing Stone Age art before creating their own!

Year 4 have settled back into school life with great enthusiasm, showing eagerness, curiosity, and a real zest for learning. We have proudly chosen our school council members, who will represent our classes with responsibility and care. In addition, we have begun our exciting new topic on the Amazon Rainforest, which has already captured our interest and





In geography, as part of their mountains topic, Year 5 have been studying how mountains are formed and learning the names of different mountains.
