# Did you know...

If your child finishes the year with 95% attendance they will still have missed 10 school days, which equates to around 55 hours of learning time? In fact, if your child misses just one day in the week it equates to them missing 20%, with their weekly attendance sitting at just 80%.

Remember: every day counts!

## **In-School Updates: This Week**



In Foundation, we read the story 'Leaf Man' and we created our own leaf people out of the leaves we collected on our autumn walk. We went on an autumn walk around our school field. We collected lots of leaves that were red, orange, yellow, brown and green. We searched for leaves that were big and small. We used the leaves to sort them into two groups, big and small. We also used the leaves we collected to make leaf rubbings using crayons. We used our hand and arm to create the trunk and branches of a tree. We used our fingers to select autumn colours and print the leaves.

To conclude our topic on Living Things and Their Habitats, Year 4 enjoyed a woodland walk around the school grounds to explore the different plants and animals in our environment. Pupils created a tally of their findings and later analysed the results back in the classroom, discussing the variety of habitats and living things they discovered.





Year One have been enjoying the story The Tiger Who Came to Tea by Judith Kerr. Inspired by the story, the children have been busy creating their own party food lists and writing descriptive sentences about the tiger using a range of exciting adjectives. In the creative area, they've let their imaginations run wild by making their very own colourful tiger faces.
